- 6. Help others: You may have more experience with online discussions than others, give them a hand and be patient.
- 7. Be willing to listen: Keep an open mind when reading other users' posts and be willing to consider their perspectives, even if you do not agree with them.
- 8. Engage in constructive criticism: If you disagree with someone, express your opinion in a respectful and constructive manner. Avoid personal attacks or insults.
- 9. Be mindful of others' privacy: Do not share personal information about others without their permission.
